

# Cancellation of the Deerland Peaking Station Energy Connection in the Fort Saskatchewan area

*The Maxim Power Corp. request for transmission system access to connect its Deerland Peaking Power Station (Facility) in the Fort Saskatchewan area has been cancelled.*

## BACKGROUND

The Alberta Utilities Commission (Commission) originally approved the AESO's *Deerland Peaking Station Energy Connection Needs Identification Document* (NID) on December 17, 2014. The NID approval included the following transmission developments:

- Add one 138 kilovolt (kV) transmission line from the existing Deerland 13S substation to the approved Skaro 109S substation.
- Modify the Deerland 13S substation, including adding one 138 kV circuit breaker.
- Re-terminate the existing 138 kV transmission line 815L at Deerland 13S substation.
- Add or modify associated equipment as required for the above transmission developments.

## NEXT STEPS

The AESO intends to apply to the Commission for cancellation of the NID approval in early 2022.
