

Southwest Calgary Ring Road – utility relocation

Progress continues as the Government of Alberta and its partners work toward construction of the final leg of the Calgary Ring Road.

The completion of the Southwest Calgary Ring Road (from 69 Street SW to Macleod Trail/Highway 2A) requires the relocation of several utilities that are directly impacted by the road construction:

- TransAlta 138kV and 240 kV transmission lines (AltaLink to relocate)
- ENMAX Power 138 kV transmission line
- City of Calgary South Richmond Storm Trunk
- ATCO Pipelines high-pressure gas line

The Government of Alberta is working with the impacted utility companies to help with their planning and design processes for relocation. We also meet with the City of Calgary and other stakeholders to share information and receive input as we work to build the Southwest Calgary Ring Road.

Depending on where you live, you will find more information about the AltaLink or ENMAX Power relocations in this package, and about all the relocations at the upcoming public information session (Feb. 24 from 4-8 at Glamorgan Community Association, 4207 41 SW). Representatives from each of the utilities, as well as The City of Calgary, the Alberta Utilities Commission and Alberta Transportation, will be on hand to answer questions.
