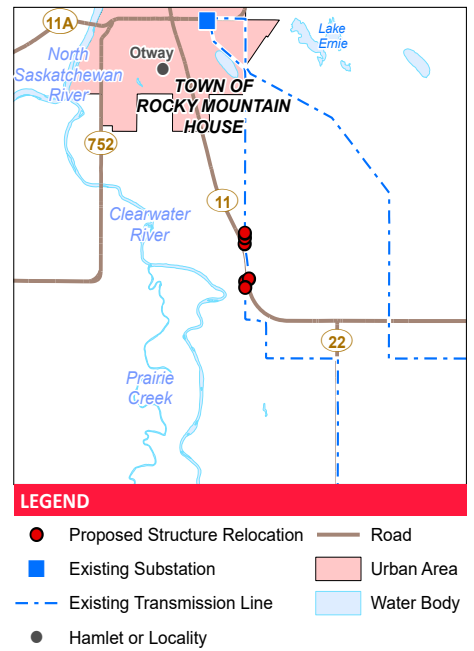


870L Transmission Line Relocation

You are receiving this newsletter because you are near the 870L Transmission Line Relocation project, and we want your input.

To accommodate the Highway 11 twinning project, AltaLink is proposing to modify and relocate structures on its existing transmission line called 870L. The project is located approximately three kilometres (km) south of Rocky Mountain House.

The relocations have been requested by AECOM, on behalf of the Alberta Transportation Corridors, for the Highway 11 twinning project. For more information about the project, see AECOM contact information included in this newsletter.

Project details

The proposed modifications and relocations are in two different locations south of Rocky Mountain House:

- an approximately 300 metres (m) section south of Township Road 391
- an approximately 400 m section north of Township Road 391

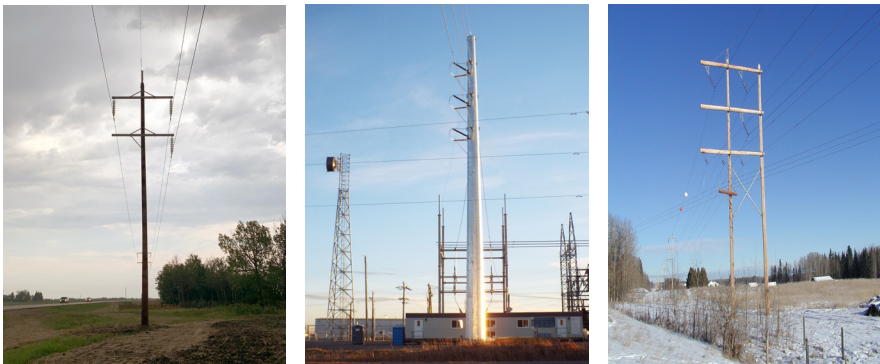
The proposed modifications and relocations south of Township Road 391 include:

- removing five existing wood monopole structures, approximately 16-24 m tall
- replacing the structures being removed with three monopole structures made of wood and steel, and one wood H-frame structure, each approximately 16-26 m tall
- modifying the angle of the existing 870L215 H-frame structure
- replacing a portion of transmission line conductor that crosses Highway 11
- shifting the transmission line centreline by up to 20 m to accommodate the relocated structures

The proposed modifications and relocations north of Township Road 391 include:

- removing two existing wood monopole structures and one wood H-frame structure, approximately 16-24 m tall
- replacing the three structures being removed with two wood monopole structures and one wood H-frame structure, each approximately 16-26 m tall
- shifting the transmission line centreline by up to 5 m to accommodate the relocated structures

More information about the proposed modifications and relocations can be found on the map included in this package.



The new wood monopole structures will look similar to the photo on the left. The new 870L210 steel monopole structure will look similar to the photo in the centre. The new H-frame structures will look similar to the photo on the right. One structure will require guy wires installed within road allowance.

Providing your input

We will contact landowners, residents and occupants near the proposed project to gather input and address questions or concerns.

After our consultation and notification process is complete, we will file an application with the AUC.

We will notify stakeholders when we file the application and again once the AUC has reached a decision about the project.
